Bayerische Motoren Werke AG (BMW), (English: *Bavarian Motor Works*) is a German automobile, motorcycle and engine manufacturing company. Founded in 1916, it is known for its performance and luxury vehicles. It owns and produces the MINI brand, and is the parent company of Rolls-Royce Motor Cars.

The circular blue and white BMW logo is portrayed by BMW as the movement of an aircraft propeller, to signify the white blades cutting through the blue sky.

Current models



BMW 3-Series

The 1 Series, launched in 2004, is BMW's smallest car, and available in coupe/convertible) and hatchback forms. The 3 Series, a compact executive car include the sport sedan, station wagon, coupe and convertible. In some countries, it has even outsold cheaper models.



BMW 7-Series

BMW's full-size executive sedan is the 7 Series. Featuring one of the world's first hydrogen fueled internal combustion engines, is fueled by liquid hydrogen and emits only clean water vapor.



BMW X3 SUV (E83)

The X3, BMW's smallest crossover SUV debuted in 2003. It was marketed in Europe as an off-roader. The all-wheel drive X5 is a mid-size luxury SUV sold by BMW since 2000. The X6 is marketed as a "Sports Activity Coupe" by the BMW since 2007.

BMW M models

Based on the 3 Series, the M3 defined an entirely new market for BMW: a race-ready production vehicle. The newest V8-powered platform became available the Autumn of 2007 in Europe, and second quarter of 2008 for the U.S. in coupe, and later the cabriolet, and sedan variants. Based on the 5 Series, the M5 is the M division's V10-powered version of the E60 5 Series.
